## Standing with Immigrants in the U.S.

In the Diocese of Rochester, Bishop Matano and our Diocesan Public Policy Committee are calling on parishes to take part in Share the Journey.

In concert with the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, we'll be speaking out in support of the **DREAM Act** (Development, Relief and Education for Alien Minors Act).

The Catholic Church and many other people of good will have long been standing with the "Dreamers". These are young people brought to this country without documents as children. They grew up here, speak English, are part of the culture and consider themselves Americans. America is their home.

For these young people who are in school or have graduated from high school, are in good standing with the law, and go through specific and rigorous background checks, this legislation would provide permanent residency status. This means they could not be deported and could work legally. This is their dream— a stable, decent life without fear of being ripped away from their families.
